## DOCUMENTATION



This file provides instructions for installation, help on getting started and basic documentation of supported features. It is recommended you read it thoroughly to leverage the theme's functionality and capabilities. Hope you will enjoy building with Bakery as much as we enjoyed developing it!

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## General info

Bakery is a premium, powerful yet easy to set up WordPress Theme made especially for Bakery, Cake shops and Restaurants. It comes with advanced and flexible options making the theme one of the best and most suitable food themes available in the marketplace. Moreover, it is pixelperfect designed and meets the newest trend web experience.

We would like to thank you for purchasing Bakery! We are very pleased that you have chosen Bakery for your website, you will not be disappointed!

## Setup and updates

Before you get started, please be sure to take a look at our Documentation. Bakery is developed to be used with WordPress and we assume that you already have WordPress installed and ready to go. If you do not, please see the following section to help you get started.

## WordPress Installation

In order to install the theme, you must have a working version of WordPress already installed. WordPress is well-known for its ease of installation. Under most circumstances installing WordPress is a very simple process and takes less than five minutes to complete. Many web hosts now offer tools to automatically install WordPress for you. However, if you wish to install WordPress yourself, check the link below to read about the installation process.

## Theme Installation

You can install the theme in two ways: through WordPress, or via FTP. The **Bakery.zip** file is the Installable WordPress Theme and what you need to use to get the theme installed. Please see the following sections for more information for each method. But first, you need to download the Bakery files from your Themeforest account. Navigate to your downloads tab on Themeforest and next to the Bakery click the download button to see the two options; The Main Files and the Installable WordPress Theme.

Once you download the theme, unzip the main item and you will see the following file:

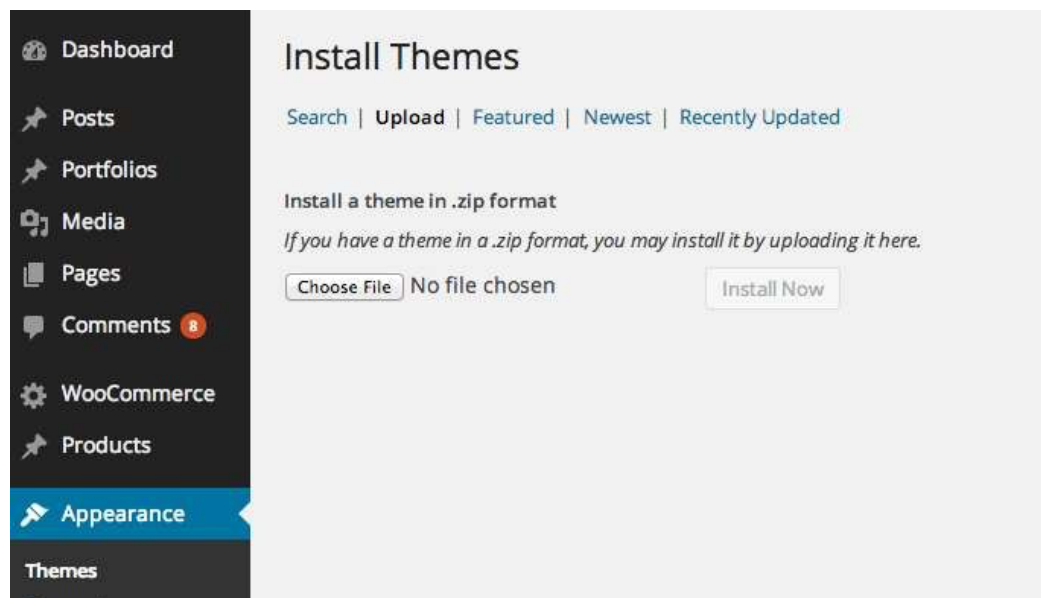
- Bakery.zip - theme files that you will need to upload them into your WordPress themes directory.

**Warning!** In order to use Bakery, you must be running a recent WordPress version, PHP7 or higher, and mysql 5 or higher. Below is a list of items you should ensure your host can comply

- Check to ensure that your web host has the minimum requirements to run WordPress.
- Always make sure they are running the latest version of WordPress
- You can download the latest release of WordPress from official [WordPress](https://wordpress.org/) website
- Always create secure passwords FTP and Database

### Installing the theme through your WordPress Dashboard

Installing a theme through WordPress is quite a simple process. After you have logged into WordPress account and are ready to go, in the admin panel's sidebar navigate to appearance and then select themes. After that, click on the install themes tab and select upload from the navigation bar right below it. Click "choose file" button and locate your theme zip file (bakery.zip) then hit install now. After Bakery has been installed locate and click activate.

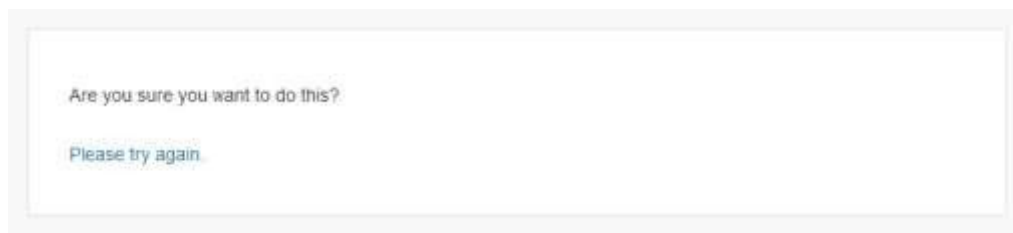


Note: Please be informed that you should not upload the whole item you have downloaded from Themeforest as you will get an error of broken stylesheet file. Instead locate the bakery.zip file inside the main file you have downloaded.

## Installation Through FTP

- Step 1 - Log into your hosting space via an FTP software (ex. Filezilla).
- Step 2 - Unzip the bakery.zip file and ONLY use the extracted bakery theme folder.
- Step 3 - Upload the extracted bakery theme folder to your server in the wp-content/themes
- Step 4 - Once the theme is uploaded, activate the newly installed theme. Go to Appearance > Themes and activate your uploaded theme.
- Step 5 - Then you will see a notification message to activate the required plugins. Follow the steps to install and activate each plugin.

**Warning!** While installing your theme through WordPress admin, you may encounter an error message saying “are sure you want to do this?”.



This usually occurs when either the PHP memory limit or max post size for WordPress has been reached. The easiest workaround for this is to install theme through FTP (see above). Alternatively, you'll need to change a number of settings either on WordPress or on your web host.

## Theme Activation

To unlock all theme features and be able to install demo content, you will need to activate the theme using the purchase code. Follow these steps to successfully activate the theme and troubleshoot common issues.

### 1. Get Your Purchase Code

Start by locating the purchase code on your Themeforest account. Here's how to find it (<https://d.pr/6z8Mhr>):

1. Log in to your ThemeForest account.
2. Navigate to the Downloads section.
3. Find the Bakery item.
4. Click the Download button and select License certificate & purchase code (text file).
5. Open the downloaded file to access your purchase code.

### 2. Activate the Theme

Once the theme is installed and activated, you will see a prompt:

*Theme License Validation: In order to make the theme fully functional, you need to enter your purchase code here.*

You should follow the link and

1. Enter or paste the purchase code in the provided field.
2. Click the Validate License button.

If the purchase code is valid, you will receive a confirmation message.

The theme is now activated, and you can install demo content and use all theme features.

### 3. Troubleshooting License Activation

If you encounter issues while activating your theme, consider the following solutions:

- **Error Message: "Purchase code has been used in another domain"**

This occurs if the purchase code is already registered to another domain.

Solution: Submit a ticket through our support center or use the contact form to request a license reset. Once your request is processed, you will receive confirmation, and you can reactivate the theme.

- **Invalid Purchase Code**

Verify that the purchase code is correct and copied from the license certificate file.

### 4. Re-validating the License

You may need to re-activate the theme if you migrate your site to a new domain, reset your database, or reinstall the theme. Follow these steps to re-validate the license:

1. Before making changes, deactivate the license from your WordPress admin dashboard.
2. Use the original purchase code to activate the theme again.

## Plugin Installation

Bakery includes a few plugins that need to be installed and activated. Bakery Options, Bakery Shortcode, WPBakery Page Builder, Slider Revolution, and Contact Form plugins are required for the theme to work; they contain all of the theme features like shortcodes, slider, products, etc.

The installation of plugins will be required after the theme activation. Follow the steps below to install and activate them.

1. Go to Appearance > Install Plugins
2. Hover the mouse over the plugin, and click install.
3. From dashboard menu go to Plugins
4. Find the pugin and activate them

Or via FTP, by uploading and extracting the plugin zip files into wp-content/plugins folder. You can find the zip files for plugin installation in the theme folder royal/framework/plugins.

## Demo content

After installing and activating the theme and all bundled plugins, you can get started by installing demo data:

1. Go to Bakery > Install Demo Content
2. Select your demo and click Install. If you need a clean install, make sure to check Reset WordPress Database (it deletes all content and media).

That's it, you're good to go!

## How to Update the Theme

To update the theme please follow the steps below:

1. Make full backup of your files
2. Download the latest version of the theme from <https://themeforest.net/downloads>
3. Go to your WordPress admin dashboard
  - a. Remove theme license
  - b. From left menu select Appearance > Themes
  - c. Activate a WordPress default theme like Twenty Seventeen or Twenty Sixteen. Don't worry, all your settings made in our theme will be kept and not overwritten
  - d. Remove Bakery theme
  - e. Upload the latest theme version you downloaded from Themeforest and activate it.
  - f. Finally, make sure to install the latest plugin versions from Appearance > Install Plugins.

That's all!

If you plan to modify the source code of the main parent theme, we strongly recommend to install child theme and make such modifications inside this child theme in order to avoid any possible problems & issues by installing updates of the main parent theme in future.

## Logo

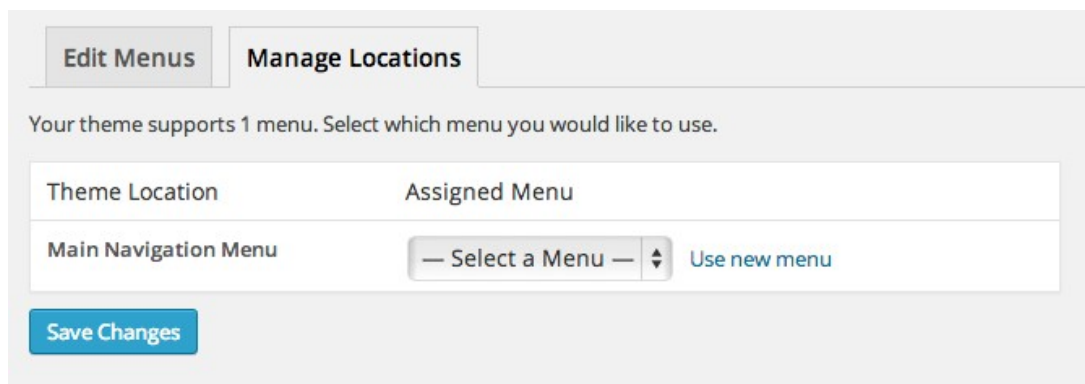
You can change logo at the 'Theme option > General section. You can upload 2x size image, then specifying the logo size to make it look sharp on retina device as well.

## Main menu

You can create menu by going to 'Appearance > Menu' section.



After you finished creating the menu, try assigning it to themes location at the 'Manage Location' section.






## Homepage

Go to 'Page > Add New' to create new page. Then choose Home as a template.

Set the page as Homepage


Go to 'Setting > Reading' area. Choose the front page as static page and select the page you want to be homepage.

## Permalinks settings

We do suggest you to setup the best permalinks structure for your site, to do so apply the changes based on the image below.

## Shortcodes

Shortcodes are an easy way to place the theme's main elements on a page. While a lot of them are the same as the elements available in the page builder (Visual Composer), some are unique such as the order form & weekly offer shortcodes so it's important to not exclude using them all together if you prefer the page builder as some will still prove useful.

## Columns

Every time you are dealing with columns it is imperative that you check the "Last Column" check box for the last column in every row. A row ends every time your columns add up to a whole. If you fail to do this, your columns will not function correctly. Columns can display anything you put into them, this includes all other shortcodes except the carousel. The carousel shortcode must be on its own and not in a column

## Team Member

The team shortcode takes in all the information for a team member/employee and formats it nicely. This shortcode works best when used in a 1/3 column. If you have more than 3 team members/employees, you could create a carousel and add each team member on a slide.

## Clients

The clients shortcode allows you to format all of your clients in either a carousel or column based layout. Simply choose the number of columns you desire, mark whether or not you would like a carousel, and begin uploading your images.

## Recent Posts/Work

These two shortcodes give you a simple way to have more control over where you want to display your recent content. The only configuration option is whether or not to show the title labels that you defined in the theme options panel.

## Theme options

The options panel is home to all of the theme's extensive configuration options. To view the panel, navigate to the Bakery item in the left-hand menu. There you have the ability to alter many core aspects that make up how your theme looks and behaves. Any of the options that have some ambiguity to them conveniently have descriptions to explain their purpose.

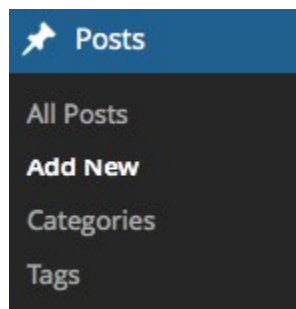
## Slider

Bakery gives you a powerful way to feature any content your heart desires. But they aren't just lovely to look at, they're also amazingly easy to manage! We have built a slider custom post type to simplify adding, editing, ordering and deleting slides. The included slider allows for a quick slider to be automatically placed at the top of the home page (as long as a home template is selected in the page attributes box)

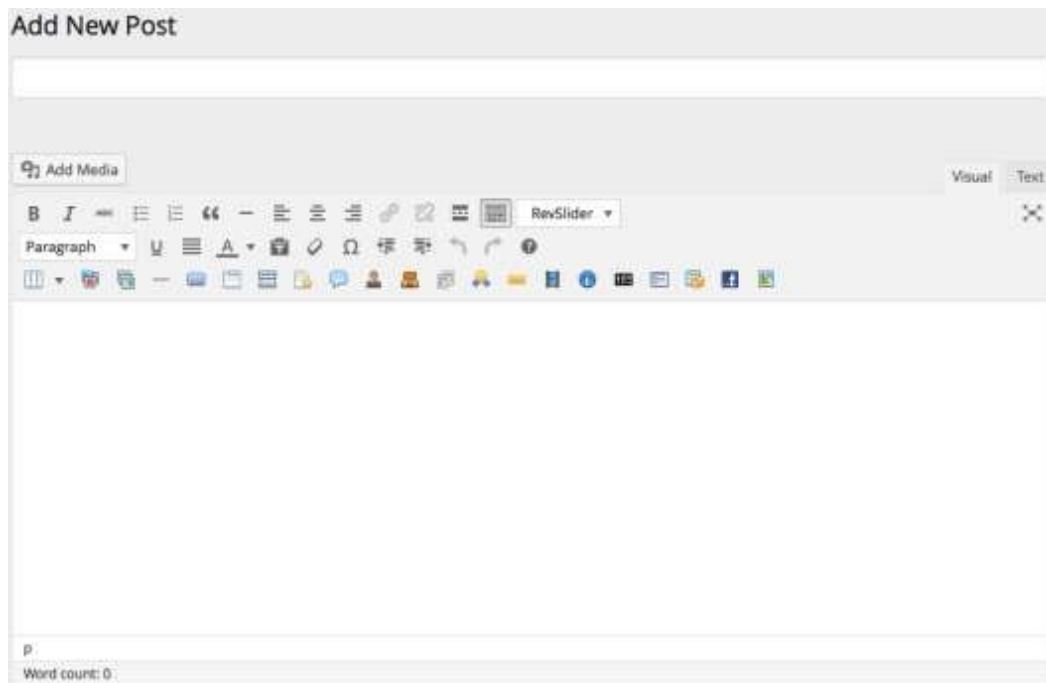
## Blog

### Creating Blog Posts


Step 1: Navigate to Posts > Add New.



Step 2: Input a title and content in the corresponding fields.



Step 3: Select blog post format.



### Post Format

Step 4: Select the Categories on the right side. You can select more than one Category by clicking on the checkboxes.

Step 5: Choose and add appropriate tags.



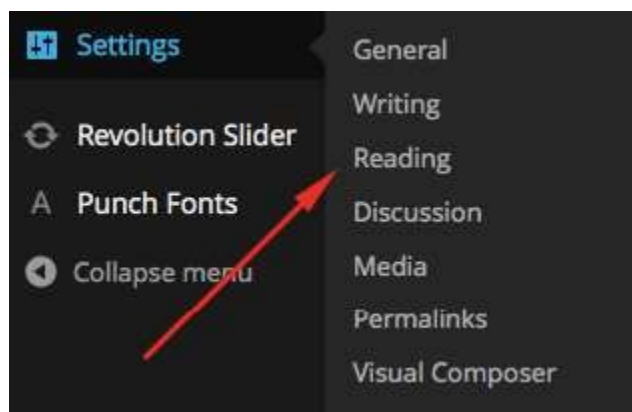

## Footer & Widgets

You can change the footer layout or hide it at the 'Theme option > Footer' section. After that, you may assign the widget to footer 1 2 3 and 4 in the 'Appearance > Widget' area (if select the footer that has 2 columns, footer style 3 and 4 will not be any use).

Copyright area can be assigned also by going to 'Theme option > Footer > Copyright' section.

## Custom Widgets

Your theme also includes a couple custom widgets as an added bonus. Actually, these widgets are implemented as shortcodes which have the possibility to be used in the text area of the widgets. The following shortcodes are included.

## Multi Language Support

Bakery can be easily translated in to your own language.

### **Language Translation using Poedit (Free) by creating a .po file**

- Download and install [Poedit](#) if you haven't done so already.
- Find bakery.pot file under Bakery theme folder /lang (e.g. /wp-content/themes/bakery/lang/bakery.pot)

- Open the .pot file in Poedit.
- Go to File / Save as... to save your translations in a .po file. If you do not know how to name it, take a look at this page: [Translating WordPress With Poedit](#). The name you should use is the combination of the project's text domain (locate it inside codes) and a short string in parentheses next to a language's name (e.g. French – Français (fr\_FR)). For example, if the text domain is entrepreneur and the translation is French, just name the .po file bakery-fr\_FR.
- When you have finished translating, go to File → Save as... again to generate the .mo file. Or you can set your Poedit to always compile a .mo file when saving changes by clicking File / Preferences and on the Editor tab check the Automatically compile .mo file on save box.
- Open your wp-config.php file in a text editor and search for: define ('WPLANG', '');
- Edit this line according to the .mo file you've just created, e.g. define ('WPLANG', bakery-fr\_FR');

### How to get twitter authentication info

There're 4 fields available when you use twitter widget. You have to follow these following steps to get all twitter access info for this.

- Go to <https://dev.twitter.com/apps>
- Sign in on your twitter account
- Click 'Create New Application' button
- fill all required fields

## Adding / modify php code

If you don't want to modify the theme files every time you update the theme, you have to create the child theme to modify the php code for this. You can find the tutorial about how to create the child theme [here](#)

is point to the original theme folder.

Our theme wrap every function with `if( !function_exists('some_function') )` command, so if you want to use any function, just declare it in the function.php file of the child theme and it'll overwrite the existing one.
